




FY 2024 – 2025 ENDOWMENT IMPACT

Grant Gibson Interdisciplinary Research Laboratory The new physics lab was made possible by Dr. Grant Gibson, and engages students from a wide range of majors in hands-on, interdisciplinary research—spanning fields like materials science, biophysics, geophysics, nuclear physics, applied optics, and acoustics—under the guidance of physics faculty.

Maraist Financial Services Lab

Services Lab was made possible by UL Lafayette alumnus Michael P. Maraist and his family who donated the initial gift to begin construction. The Lab exposes students to real-world experience in portfolio management, financial strategy and trading. The state-of-the-art lab houses 12 Bloomberg Terminals, an electronic ticker tape display, and a digital data board. Students learn about finance and investment management in a way that can't be found in a traditional classroom.

As a forward thinker, and one who thought about others, Donald Mosing's footprint on UL Lafayette's campus will give generations of students a head start on their own paths to success. A Legacy of Learning: Rita and Mark DeVries Empower Future Teachers

For as long as they can remember, Rita (Domingue) and Mark DeVries have witnessed how a quality education can transform a child's life. They've seen how inspiring teachers motivate students and forever change the direction of their futures.

Mark's mother taught in a tiny one-room schoolhouse, sparking young minds and igniting his respect for the profession. Rita, a graduate of the University of Southwestern Louisiana—now the University of Louisiana at Lafayette—worked with special needs children while living in Africa, Venezuela and Indonesia. Their shared commitment to education inspired their two daughters to become teachers. Now retired, the DeVries remain devoted to fostering the next generation of educators.

Rita and Mark wanted to ease the financial burdens a college education can impose. In 2021, they established the Rita and Mark DeVries Endowed Scholarship in Education to help students pursue degrees in Elementary Education without the weight of overwhelming debt. Their generosity has already changed the lives of nearly a dozen recipients—and they're just getting started. "Education is the gift that keeps on giving," Mark says.

Thanks to Rita and Mark DeVries, future teachers like Maria, Emma and Emilee can follow their calling with confidence. Their generosity ensures classrooms across Louisiana—and beyond—will be filled with passionate educators for generations to come.

As she puts it, choosing to study at UL Lafayette was a no brainer! It allowed her to stay close to home, family and friends.

She is grateful to the DeVries for their commitment in helping future elementary educators achieve their dreams. “I always knew that I wanted to make a difference in the world, and no one makes a bigger difference than teachers. They have the power to educate the next generation and change the world,” Emilee declared. “College can be extremely expensive, so I am extremely grateful to have been given this scholarship. Knowing that other people support my dream by awarding me this scholarship means the world to me,” she said.

Inspiring the Next Generation of Nurses

Dr. James Blankenship (pictured) is a rising star at the University of Louisiana at Lafayette and was recently named Assistant Professor in the College of Nursing & Health Sciences. For Dr. Blankenship, nursing education is more than a career—it's a calling. He is driven to provide hands-on training for life-sustaining care and has witnessed firsthand how the demand for skilled, compassionate nurses continues to outpace the supply of qualified professionals. That urgency fuels his focus on preparing the next generation of front-line healthcare providers.

As Coordinator of the Accelerated BSN program, Dr. Blankenship teaches a wide range of courses—adult medical-surgical, community, psychiatric, pediatric, maternal-newborn, and leadership—and oversees the clinical education that brings these subjects to life.

His work is strengthened by the Dr. Anne Bienvenu Broussard/BORSF Endowed Professorship in Nursing, a prestigious and competitive award made possible through the generosity of Dr. Anne Bienvenu Broussard (pictured). A proud UL Lafayette graduate and longtime registered nurse and educator, Dr. Broussard has dedicated her life to mentoring young faculty. She sees this gift as a way to continue supporting nursing education at the university that shaped her own career.

“The support I have received from Dr. Broussard through her establishment of this endowment has empowered me to inspire the next generation of registered nurses with purpose and passion,” Dr. Blankenship shares. “Her gift is a meaningful investment in the future of skilled, knowledgeable, and compassionate healthcare providers for countless communities. People like Dr. Broussard and her family greatly enhance the quality of nursing education, and that impact is clearly reflected in the care our graduates provide.”

For Dr. Broussard, the connection is personal. “I am delighted with the choice of Dr. Blankenship as the recipient of the endowed professorship,” she says. “He recognizes the challenges students face—including the high cost of textbooks—and is finding creative ways to help. He has a clear vision for what's needed.”

Engineering a New Era of Learning

College of Engineering Dean Ahmed Khattab envisioned a future where graduates leave the University of Louisiana at Lafayette fully prepared for today's rapidly evolving workforce. To bridge the gap between traditional engineering education and the skills employers demand, he imagined the Engineering Center of Excellence (ECoE)—soon to be housed in the nearly 65,000-square-foot Engineering Student-Centered Collaborative Building currently under construction. The Center will cultivate critical abilities that set UL Lafayette engineers apart: problem solving, communication, teamwork, community engagement, and global awareness.

This groundbreaking initiative inspired Alexis and Greg Guidry. Greg, a 1982 mechanical engineering graduate who retired as a senior executive after a 37-year career with Shell, explains, "Skills developed in areas such as critical thinking, communications, teamwork, community service, and international cultural awareness are especially valuable in today's global economy, regardless of industry."

"My experience at the College shaped me in a way that undoubtedly impacted my career," Greg recalls. "The caring faculty and the culture of the community provided me with not only the technical abilities to be a successful engineer but also the professional capabilities to be a successful leader in the industry. The College punches above its weight!"

- Peer Mentors
- Study Abroad Ambassador Scholarships
- Enhanced Mosing Student Career Development Program
- Industry Events and Workshops for Career Readiness
- Industry Partnership Program
- Continuing Engineering Education Program (CEEP)

In addition to supporting the ECoE, the Guidrys' generous gift funds the Greg Guidry Energy Systems Lab, providing hands-on technical training, and establishes the Greg Guidry Engineering Innovation Endowed Chair, ensuring world-class faculty will guide students through these transformative experiences for generations to come.

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Understanding Your Endowment Report

The following information provides terms and definitions to assist you in reading your endowment report.

Fiscal Year:

Your report contains data about the indicated fund from the UL Lafayette Foundation's most recent, audited fiscal year (July 1, 2024 to June 30, 2025).

Market Value of Endowment:

Fair market value of your endowment account as of the indicated date(s).

Gifts Received:

Total amount of contributions received during the fiscal year. Gifts from donors can be in the form of cash, stocks/securities, real estate and other assets.

Net Investment Income, Gains & Losses:

Interest, dividends, realized and unrealized gains (losses), net of investment-related expenses.

Administrative Service Fee:

The fee paid to the UL Lafayette Foundation to partially fund operational costs, including oversight and administration of endowment accounts. For Fiscal Year 2025, this fee was 1.5% of the average monthly balance of the market value of your endowment.

Endowment Expenditures:

Funds provided by your endowment to the University in support of and in accordance with the endowment's purpose. Each fiscal year, the UL Lafayette Foundation provides a spendable amount to the University, in accordance with the UL Foundation's endowment spending policy. For Fiscal Year 2025, the spending policy amount was 4.25% of the average quarterly market value of the endowment through June 2024.

Transfers (if applicable):

Funds transferred to or from another endowment or non-endowed account, typically at the directive of the donor.

FY 2026 Endowment Budget:

Amounts available for spend by the University, from your endowment account, during the current fiscal year 2026.
